From Litchfield: Follow Rte. 118, To Rte 254. Follow Rte 254 south, 6 miles to light. Make L onto Knife Shop Road.

From the South: Rte 8 N to exit 38 At ramp go L. At 3rd light turn L onto Rte 254 N. Follow to light, turn R onto Knife Shop Road.

From the East: 84 West to Rte. 4 exit 39. Follow Rte 4 straight off ramp. Take Rte 4 approx. 30 minutes, it connects to Rte.118. Follow Rte.118 through Harwinton toward Litchfield to Rte. 254. Turn L on Rte. 254 S, follow it 6 miles to light. Turn L onto Knife Shop Road.

From the South: RT 8N to exit 44, L onto E. Main St, at intersection of E. Main and Main St (Warner Theatre on right), get into middle lane. Round median turn left onto Water St. Follow to first light and make a right onto Prospect, make immediate L into Trinity parking lot.

From the North: I-84W to exit 39, Farmington, Take Rte 4W to Harwinton. Stay on Rte 4 until it meets Rte 202 (E Main St. in Torrington) Turn L onto E. Main St. and continue to Main St. Get in middle lane around median and turn left up Water St. to light. Take a R onto Prospect St. and immediate L into Trinity parking lot.
